Hi Siegmar, hope you are well.

I just came across an item on eBay you might find interesting: ebay.co.uk ... 7321369546. It looks very similar to the „Cherub“ comport doesn't it? Apparently it is by a British company called M & J Guggenheim Ltd, and has the design registration number „755635“ on the base. This can be verified on the „Great Glass“ website here: www.great-glass.co.uk/glass%20notes/regnos09.htm.

According to the Great Glass website, the reg number „755635“ was registered by „M & J Guggenheim Ltd“ on „16th June 1930“. This is around a month before the design number for the „Cherub“ comport „756470“ would have been registered. Could this mean the Cherub comport was also made or imported by M & J Guggenheim Ltd?

„This is a beautiful vaseline (uranium) glass Comport which was made by M & J Guggenheim Ltd. **From my information Guggenheim made very high quality pressed glass in England in the 1930's which was predominantly exported.** The comport has a satin finish on all surfaces and it comes in the form of an art deco lady in typical deco pose wearing a flowing robe sitting on chunky deco style base. It has a **registration number 755635 embossed** on the underside of the base which indicates the design was first registered in June 1930, and is made to the highest quality. It measures 9.00" tall and has a 10.75 diameter bowl attached. In normal daylight the glass is a vibrant lime green color and when displayed under black (UV) light has the trademark green "glow" to it. [...]

Hi Siegmara,

from what I can remember, I sent a picture of the Cherubs Comport to **Broadfield House Museum** (<http://www.glassmuseum.org.uk/>) and they said it was most likely to be imported by **Jules A. Lang & Sons**. It had the Reg No 756470 on the base. I had then a look at the „Great Glass“ website <http://www.great-glass.co.uk/glass%20notes/regnos09.htm> (**Registered Design numbers 750,000 to 799,999**) and although 756470 wasn't there, 4 other numbers close to it (755881, 756280, 756548, 756549) were all registered by Jules Lang, so it seemed likely that this was also im-

ported by Jules Lang. From this I also worked out it must have been registered in July 1930. I realise though this isn't a 100 % positive ID and I have altered the description on my website slightly.

SG: Nach dem Tafelaufsatz „Cherub“ glaube ich, dass der Tafelaufsatz „Guggenheim“ eher ebenfalls ein Import aus der Tschechoslowakei in den 1930-er Jahren ist. Die Reg.No. wurde dann nicht für den Hersteller sondern wie bei Lang für den Importeur beantragt und vergeben.

In „Pottery Glass & Glass Trade Review“ 1930 habe ich die Firmen „**M & J Guggenheim Ltd**“ oder „**Jules A. Lang & Sons**“ nicht gefunden.
