International Conference on 19 & 20 May 2011 at The King's Manor, University of York, UK

The conference will bring together historical, ethnographic, scientific, and new archaeological research to study **glass use in the East and West during the Late Antique period** (4th to 8th centuries), the different traditions in the two geographic regions, and the apparent fragmentation of the glass industry in the West in comparison to that in the **Byzantine and Sasanian** empires. It will also focus on the development of **trading networks** in early medieval Europe, in the eastern Empires, and in the **early Islamic** world through the medium of glass.

Conference fee: £ 90 (£ 45 for students); single day fee £ 60 (£ 30 for students)


